Annual Running Costs Of Community Centre

It currently costs approx € 4k to maintain the Community Centre. This does not cover costs for maintenance and repairs.

Costs are mainly made up of:
Insurance - € 1,800

Text System - € 1,000

Heating Oil - € 400

Accounting Fees - € 600

Water Charges - € 200

SDCC CE Programme

Davy Dillon is employed by the council as part of the SDCC CE Programme to maintain the village areas. We are delighted with all the hard work, and would like to acknowledge his contribution to how well the village is looking.

Grants

A number of grants have been applied for and awarded. We received € 20k from the 'Rural Leader Fund' to renovate part of the Community Centre and to create a Tram Stop memorial & seating. SDCC provided grants towards railings, doors, gate & benches for the grounds. We are are currently seeking a grant to install CCTV in the Centre.

Defibrillator

A defibrillator was purchased for the Community with funds raised from a fundraiser night. It is located at the front of the Community Centre. A code is required to access the Defibrillator. The code is C4582 and is also located under the defibrillator box. There is also a list of mobile numbers to contact for assistance in using the Defib. We have run some Basic Life Support courses, where a number of Brittas residents have been trained in the use of the Defibrillator and in basic life saving skills. Crooksling Action Group

A fundraiser night was held last June to raise money to fund the work of the Action Group to keep Crooksling open and thus continue to provide employment to the local community. A public meeting was held on December 2nd, with Brittas residents, Public representatives, Minister Zappone and architects. On January 25th of this year, Councillor Emer Higgins arranged a meeting with Crooksling Action Group, Dept of Health, & Senior HSE Officials in Leinster house to show proposals for possible development of Crooksling into a National Centre for Excellence of Elder care. A further meeting in March will be arranged to discuss more details with relevant parties.
